Kindergarten Academic Descriptors for Parents

LITERACY

Letter/Word Work

- **Recites Alphabet** The student is able to accurately recite the alphabet without singing.
- Names Capital Letters- The student can automatically tell the name of each capital letter individually or as part of a word.
- Names Lower Case Letters- The student can automatically tell the name of each lower case letter individually or as part of a word.
- **Identifies Beginning Consonant Sounds** The student can automatically give the name of the letter that starts a given word and can produce the sound when seeing the letter while reading.
- **Says Rhyming Words** The student can provide 3 or more rhyming words for any given word (they may be nonsense words).
- **Recognizes High Frequency Words** The student can automatically read the words individually or in a story.

Comprehension of Instructional Level

- Uses strategies to comprehend- The student is able to make predictions and retell a story.
- Makes connections between text and life experiences-The student can think about stories read and things learned to help understand a story.

WRITING

- Uses appropriate sounds to write-The student uses beginning, middle, and ending sounds to write words.
- Uses spaces between words-The student independently uses spaces when writing.
- Uses basic sight words when writing-The student independently uses sight words when writing.
 Writes story with related ideas-The student independently writes a sentence and can write details about that sentence.

FINE MOTOR

- **Prints First Name** The student is able to write his/her own name with one capital letter and the rest lower case with proper formation.
- **Cuts Accurately** The student is able to hold scissors correctly and consistently cuts shapes and lines neatly.

• Writes Numerals 0-9 with a Model- The student is able to write numerals correctly with model.

MATH

- **Counts Beyond 100-** The student is able to independently count past 100.
- **Recognizes Basic Geometric Shapes** The student is able to accurately and consistently identify the shapes of rectangle, square, circle, triangle, and rhombus.
- Counts 20 or More Objects- The student is able to correctly demonstrate one to one correspondence when counting up to 20 or more objects.
- **Reads Any Number 100 or Less** The student is able to read any number up to 100.
- Counts By 10s Beyond 110- The student is able to independently count by 10s past 110.
- Writes Any Number 100 or Less- The student is able to write any number up to 100.
- Counts By 5s Beyond 110- The student is able to independently count by 5s past 110.
- **Identifies Coins** The student is able to identify penny, nickel, dime, and quarter, using the front and/or back of the coin.
- Knows Value of Penny, Nickel, Dime, and Quarter- The student is able to correctly identify the value of each coin.
